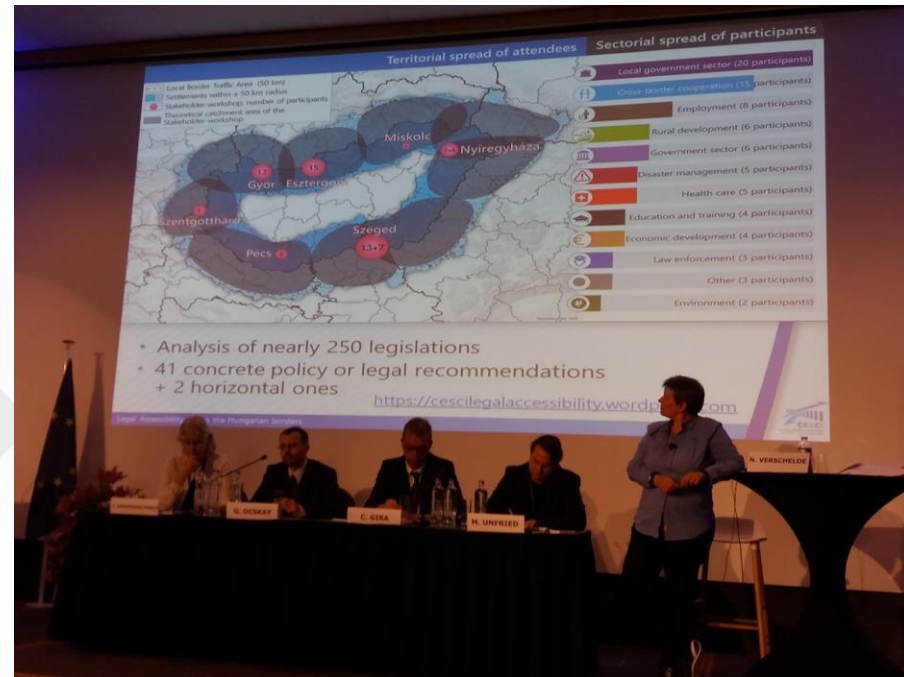

- 2018-2019: B-Solutions PILOT projects

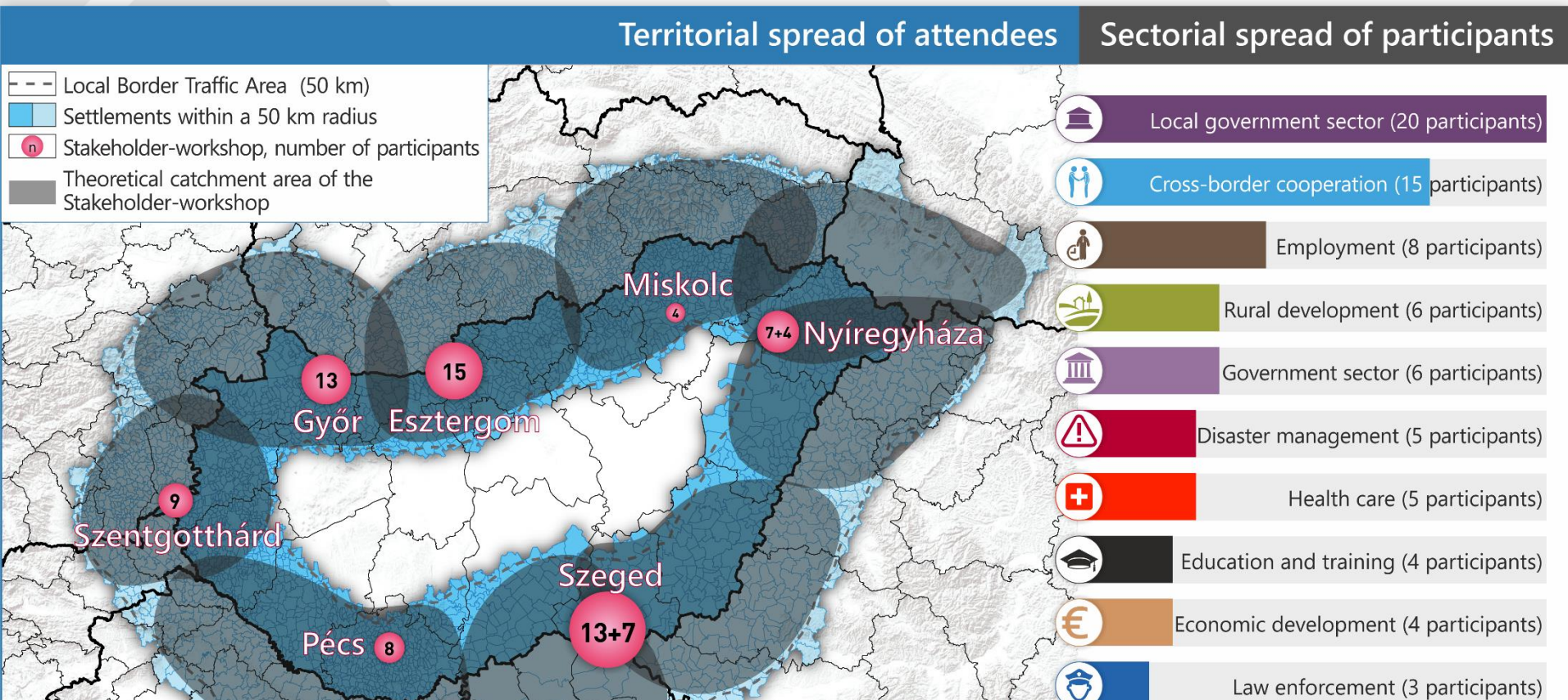


- 2018: Geo-blocking Regulation

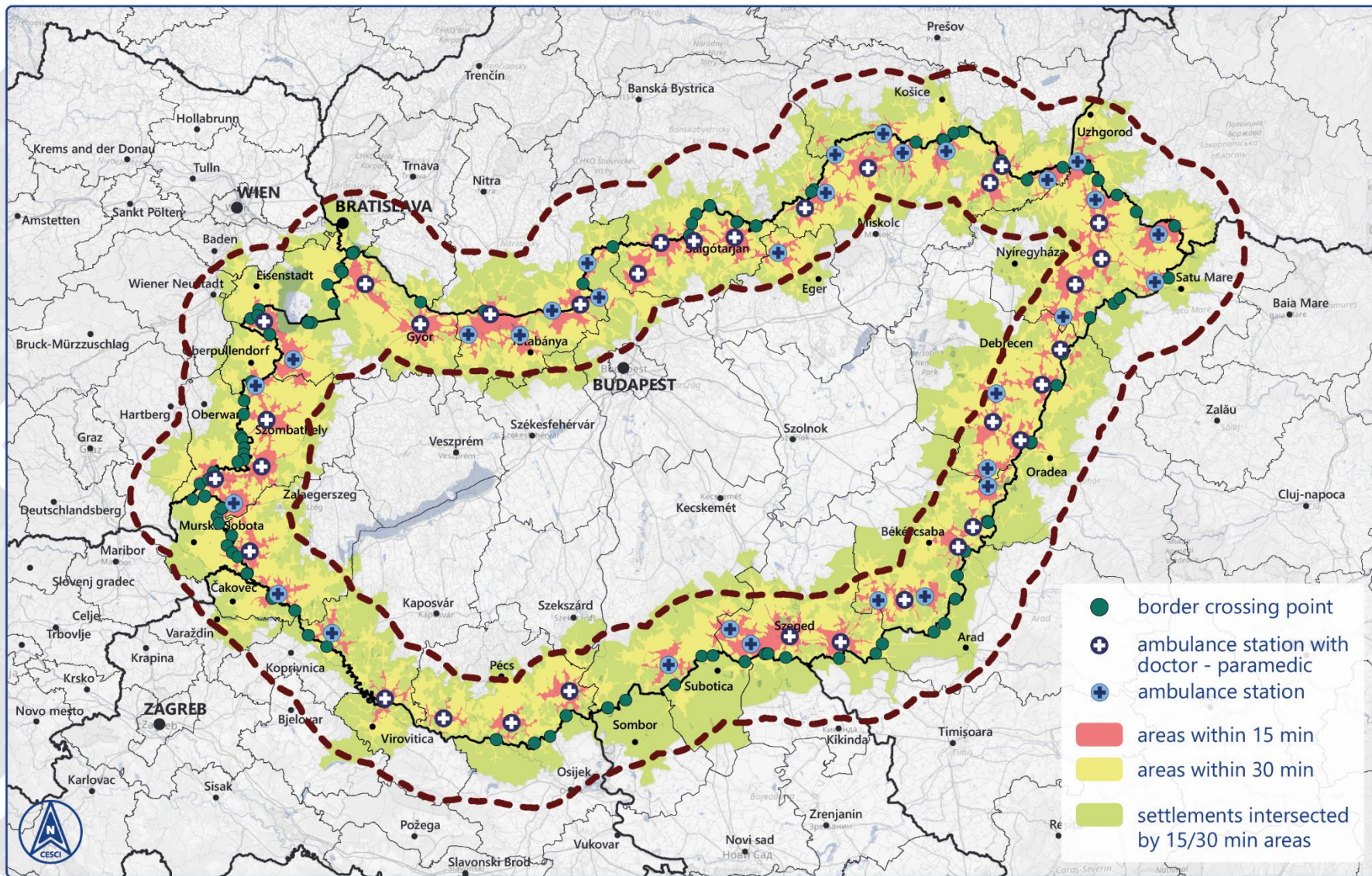

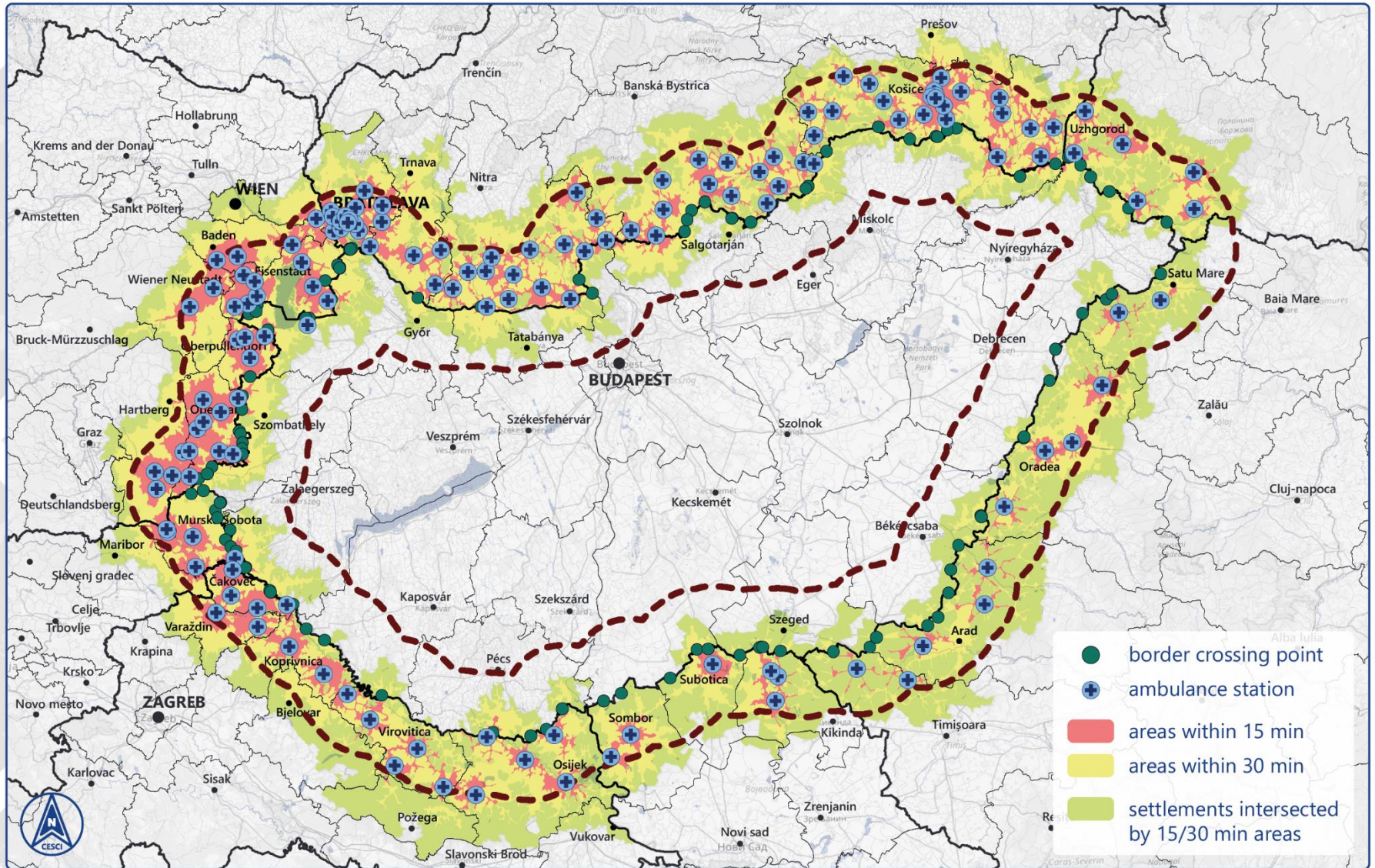
Legal accessibility along the Hungarian border

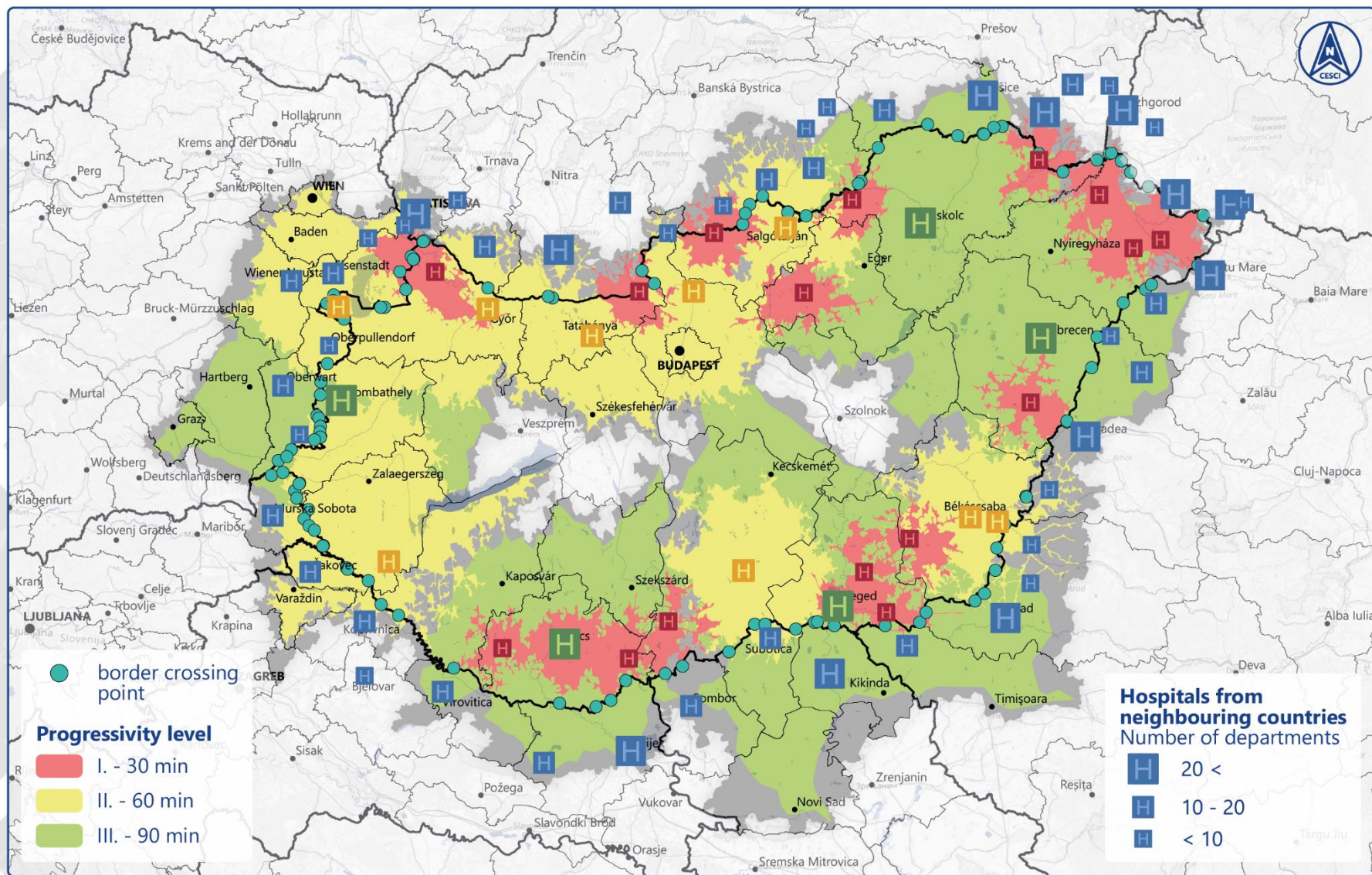
Hungarian ambulance stations within 30 km from the border and their theoretical service areas
